

FINAL INSTALLATION

The exhibit included 4 all new interpretive stations, with beautiful graphics, compelling videos, and inviting tactile & interactive elements.





These interpretive stations served as the main content hubs for both the *Leopard Forest* exhibit and larger *Africa*: *Living in Balance* exhibit. They provided centralized locations for communicating the big idea of the exhibit — that the needs of both people and wildlife must be met for all species to thrive.









Three of the stations featured interactive tables that helped visitors explore primate sounds, rhino horns, leopard patterns, and more.








THE PROCESS BEGINS


We start development with information gathering, stakeholder engagements, and a lot of research. This helps us create our foundational elements: visitor outcomes, experience goals, and perhaps most importantly, the Main Message.

Conservationists have been working diligently on a recovery program for the Southern White Rhinoceros that has seen this population grow from less than 50 rhinoceros in the early 1900s to around 18,000. Unfortunately, po habitats, even in protected areas like Africa's Kruger National Park. The Nashville Zoo actively supports White Rhinoceros conservation by establishing guard posts, developing rapid responsi support or writer minutes or states variously of examining guan posts, developing, rapid response teams, and supporting intelligence networks. The new guard posts and housing for the ranger staff have made significant progress in specific critical areas. To better assist these staff members, new digital radios have been purchased to enhance the deployment of those units.






SCHEMATIC DEVELOPMENT

3 Elevation - Left Wall Scale 1/2" = 1-0"


2 Elevation - Tent 3 - Forest - Rear Wall Scale: 1/2" = 11/0"











Design Development is also when the copy created first in Word documents begin to come to life in stunning graphic panels, infographics, and sometimes even media pieces.










We delight in seeing our designs match up seamlessly with the finished built product. Here, the entry threshold to Leopard Forest is shown in design and in final installation.
























We had the pleasure of collaborating with Australian artist Matt Hill who created a whole menagerie of corten animals that would enhance the environment and delight the visitor.























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TECHNICAL DRAWINGS AND BID DOCUMENTS

Once the design is finalized, we create technical drawings that can be used for bidding the project and communicating with the chosen fabricator. This ensures that everything can be created to match the design direction.





The Main Message of this exhibit centered on the idea of balance. Just as we need balance between the needs of people and the needs of animals for them to thrive, exhibits must balance the needs of visitors with the needs of the institution. The best exhibits are those that excite and engage visitors, providing answers to the questions they have about what they are seeing, and providing context for why they should care. Achieving these goals helps the Zoo fulfill its mission to not only steward the species in their care, but also educate their visitors about the importance of those species.
